As we look around today, it's clear we're living in uncertain times. It feels like, with every election season, people are trying to decide who's going to lead us, who's going to fix what's broken. There's a lot of promises, a lot of speeches, and plenty of finger-pointing. But if we're honest, we know that no human leader is going to bring us the lasting peace or righteousness we truly need.

The Bible speaks to this. In Isaiah 1:4, this verse sounds a lot like what we're seeing today—people turning away from God, chasing after what they think will solve their problems, but moving further away from the truth.

I don't usually get into politics, I haven't been preaching that long, and I'm not here to preach a political sermon. But with everything going on around us, especially during election seasons, it's hard to ignore how divided things can get. And the truth is, no matter who's in office, no matter what promises they make, there's only one true kingdom that will never be shaken—God's kingdom.

So today, I want to talk about that unshakeable kingdom, and why we need to focus our hearts and our hope on the One who is truly in control, no matter who holds political power."

Isaiah 1:4

Ah sinful nation, a people laden with iniquity, a seed of evildoers, children that are corrupters: they have forsaken the Lord, they have provoked the Holy One of Israel unto anger, they are gone away backward.

UNSHAKEABLE KINGDOM

This afternoon,
I want to talk
about something steady,
something strong—
something we can
truly rely on.

Let's be honest: we don't have to look hard

to see how far this country has fallen.

Isaiah's words
from Isaiah 1:4
might sound familiar
to us today:
"Ah sinful nation,
a people weighed down with sin,
children who have
turned from God..."

We look around, and it's clear this country is getting farther and farther from God.

The moral and spiritual state of things is shaky at best, and so many people are feeling lost.

Is there any hope?
Yes, there is hope.
But our hope
doesn't come
from a better economy
or from new leaders.
Our hope comes
from something unshakeable—
God's eternal kingdom.

No matter what happens to our country, God offers a kingdom that will never fall, never be taken over, and never decline.

We can't put our trust in things that change all the time.
Leaders come and go, laws get made and undone, and the world keeps shifting.
But God's kingdom doesn't change. It's solid, it's forever, and it's built on truth.

We may see chaos all around, but God is still in control.

He's offering us a place in His unshakeable kingdom, a place where we don't have to worry about the mess of this world.

Our job is to turn back to Him, to stop trusting in the things of this world and start trusting in the One who never lets us down.

When we do that, we can have peace in the middle of everything going on, because we know that God's kingdom stands strong.

The Bible tells us that when the people

of Israel served God, He blessed them. "Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord," Psalm 33:12 says.

But when they turned away, God allowed them to fall into captivity. The northern tribes were taken by Assyria, and later, the southern kingdom of Judah was conquered by Babylon, just as Isaiah warned in this very passage.

They were in bondage for 70 years because they had turned their backs on the Lord.

Today, we can clearly see
Something similar is happening.
As a nation,
we're moving
away from God,
and it's leading to
a moral and spiritual decline.

But there is good news.
We have the chance
to turn to God
and be part
of His unshakeable kingdom—
one that doesn't rely

on earthly success but on God's eternal promises.

Let's think about what it means to live for this kingdom, a kingdom that stands strong no matter what.

Living in God's kingdom means knowing that Our foundation is firm. Unlike the things of this world that can change or fall apart, God's promises remain true.

We can trust Him to provide for us, to guide us, and to give us strength when we feel weak. In His kingdom, we find true peace and joy that the world cannot give.

When we choose to live in this kingdom, we commit to following God's ways and putting our faith in Him.

It means seeking His will in our lives and sharing His love with others.

Even when everything around us seems chaotic, we can hold on to the hope that comes from being part of something much bigger than ourselves.

So let's not just look at the problems around us; let's look to God and His unshakeable kingdom. Let's strive to be examples of His love and truth in a world that desperately needs it.

Together, we can make a difference, and we can stand strong in the face of any challenge because our lives are built on the solid rock of Christ.

While we have this hope in God's kingdom, we cannot ignore the struggles we face in our nation today.

Every day in our country, many innocent lives are lost before they even have a chance to live. Families are struggling because many children are growing up without fathers. This hurts our communities and makes life harder for so many.

We've seen a shift away from God in our public lives.
Laws and court decisions have made it harder to talk about our faith openly.
This change has left a lot of people feeling lost and disconnected from God.

In the 1960s, the courts decided that prayer and Bible reading couldn't happen in schools anymore.

This was a big moment for how faith is viewed in public places.
Since then, many schools have stopped prayer at graduations, sports events, and even moments of silence.
This has made it tough for people to come together and share their beliefs.

In some places, even displaying the Ten Commandments has become a problem.
This shows how far
we've moved away
from being able
to express our faith freely.

We can't ignore the problems around us. Our nation is facing serious issues, and we see the effects of sin in the struggles people are going through every day.

Children are growing up without the guidance they need—no father figures in the home, no knowledge of God to show them the way.

It's like trying to put together a complicated piece of machinery without instructions.

Every piece is there, but without the right guidance, nothing seems to fit, and frustration builds.

In the end, it doesn't end well; the machinery is left in a total mess, In complete disarray, just like lives without direction.

We've let our country push God out of

the public square.
Taking prayer and the Bible out of schools was just the start.
This move has led to a wider separation between faith and daily life, leaving many feeling lost.

Now, people are afraid to even mention God's name in public spaces. This silence speaks volumes about how far we've drifted from the values that once shaped our nation.

It's almost like
we're trying to treat God
like that relative
we only see at Thanksgiving—
out of sight, out of mind—
until, of course, we need Him!
This attitude weakens
our connection to God
and makes us less likely
to turn to Him
in times of trouble.

Our freedom to live out our faith is being threatened more and more.

It's not just about

schools anymore;
it's happening at work,
It's happening in government,
And it's even happening
in the streets.
Everywhere we look,
there seems to be a push
to silence our beliefs
and keep our faith hidden away.

If we don't stand up for what's right, pretty soon we might have to start whispering The Ten Commandments! If we don't do something, who will?

Marriage, as God designed it, is between a man and a woman.
This is clear in scripture, where we read about "male and female" and a man being united with his wife.
Today, there are many ideas about marriage and identity that seem to stray from what we find in the Bible.

We see a wide range of beliefs about gender and relationships, which can be confusing. In our world, some people identify differently than the way
God created them.
We hear claims
of changing identities,
and it can feel like
everything is being
thrown into question.

But we must remember what Jesus taught about God creating us as "male and female."
We need to hold onto that truth amidst the noise around us.

Instead of focusing on labels or identities, let's center ourselves on God's design for us. His way is clear, and while the world may go down a different path, we are called to follow Him.

Jesus warned us about the wide road that leads to destruction. We need to check ourselves and consider where we are headed.

It feels like we're losing sight of common sense these days, with so many chasing after what seems popular.

Sometimes it seems like people are trying to make their lives a spectacle, like they're in a reality show, looking for their moment in the spotlight. But in all that noise, we risk forgetting what truly matters.

It's easy to get caught up in the chaos around us. But remember, one day Jesus will look at each of us and ask about our choices and our faithfulness.

We want to be sure
He knows us
and that we know Him.

In the midst of all this chaos, we must not forget the words of Jesus. One day, He will look at those who have turned away from Him and say, "Depart from me,

I never knew you."

In times of confusion, it's vital to hold onto the simple truths that God has laid out for us. These truths keep us grounded and help us stay focused on His purpose for our lives.

Jesus said in Matthew 24:12 that in the end times, lawlessness will increase. We're seeing this happen right before our eyes as lawless people fill the streets of our cities.

We see gangs on the streets, drugs being sold, and people with guns hurting each other. Every day, it feels like chaos is everywhere, and violence has become normal.

There are people protesting, and there are people supporting different causes, but sometimes it seems like some should just stay home.

It feels like everyone has an opinion, but not everyone

is stepping up to solve the problems we face.

And there are plenty more examples of this nation's moral decline.

From the breakdown of families to the increasing division among the people,

It's clear we are facing tough times.

Trust and respect

Has been thrown

Out the window, and many feel lonely worried, and scared about what's ahead.

The values that used to bring us together are now causing arguments, making it hard for people to connect.

As we deal with these problems, it's important to look for guidance and hope, remembering the simple truths that can help us rebuild our communities and strengthen our relationships.

But in the midst of all this, we must remember that God's kingdom stands strong and offers hope. We have a choice to make.
We can be part
of this declining world
or embrace the unshakeable kingdom
that God offers us."

Why is this country in decline?
Because the warning
God gave to Judah
and to Jerusalem through Isaiah
is just as true for us now:

Woe to the sinful nation, a people loaded with guilt, full of evildoers, children deep in corruption! They've abandoned the Lord, turned their backs on the Holy One of Israel.

Today, we see evidence of this decline everywhere.
The moral compass that once guided our society is now lost, leaving many people feeling confused and directionless.

2 Timothy 3 says,
"Men shall be lovers
of their own selves,
and lovers of pleasures
more than lovers of God."

As we saw in ancient Israel and Judah,

we see in this country today a nation declines when morality declines, and people turn their backs on God.

You don't have to look far to see how broken this country is.
Our institutions are worn down, our systems don't work, and there's a sense of hopelessness everywhere.

People are struggling to find jobs, crime rates are rising, families are falling apart, and too many people are battling addiction.

Many people are struggling to find purpose, and the values that once held us together are fading fast like ice cream on a hot summer day—just melting away before we even have a chance to enjoy it!

Families are breaking apart, communities are suffering, and trust in one another is crumbling.

It's like a house of cards—

one wrong move, and everything can come tumbling down. We're left wondering how to rebuild when the foundation feels so shaky.

People are more divided than ever. We see anger, fear, and confusion everywhere we look.

It's like the foundation we used to stand on is falling apart, leaving us scrambling to find solid ground. Instead of building each other up, we're caught in a cycle of blame and mistrust, making it harder to come together.

Families aren't sticking together,
And trust seems
Hard to find.
Everyone seems
more focused
on their own needs,
and that just leads
to more pain and separation.
It's like we're all lost at sea,
drifting further apart
with each wave

that crashes against us.

But out of all the causes we talk about,
I want to point out one that often goes unnoticed.
A hidden reason for this country's decline—hidden in plain sight because it's taken for granted—is that we have lost the fear of God.

One big reason for our country's problems that often gets overlooked is that we've lost the fear of God.

Belief in basic spiritual truths—like God, angels, heaven, hell, and the devil—is declining.

Since 2001,
belief in God
has dropped from 90% to 74%.
While some still believe
in these truths—
74% believe in God,
69% in angels,
and so on—
it's clear we've lost
that deep respect for God.

This lack of fear creates a gap between us

and our spiritual roots, making it easier for people to ignore what God says and live how they please.

When we stop holding on to these truths, our actions and choices show it.

We start to make decisions that go against God's ways and forget about the consequences.

The Bible warns us that "there is no fear of God before the eyes of the ungodly." When we lose that fear, we lose our way.

Where is the fear of God in the church today? Where is the fear of God in the pulpits? Where is the fear of God in our marriages? Where is the fear of God in our families? Where is the fear of God in how we handle our money and resources? Where is the fear of God in our friendships and the way we treat others? Where is the fear of God

in our thoughts and actions when no one is watching?

It amazes me
how fearless people
are of God.
It amazes me
how people don't care
about the truth.
It amazes me
how they focus on things
that don't matter.

It amazes me how they ignore clear signs.
It amazes me how many look for answers but skip the source.
It amazes me how hearts can become cold and uncaring.

How is it possible that someone, made in God's image and living in rebellion against Him, feels no fear about what they're doing? This absolutely makes My head hurt.

And this is happening in a country where, until recently, around 80% or more of the population

identified as Christian.

It blows my mind to think about this. How can someone who was made in God's image, someone who knows right from wrong, choose to live in sin without any fear?

It's hard to understand how so many people can call themselves Christians but live as if God doesn't exist.

It makes you wonder what happened to the fear of God in our lives.

We have to ask ourselves why so many have turned away from what they know is true.

Recent polls show that number dropping more and more.
One respected poll found that only 65% of U.S. adults now call themselves Christian.

When I think about that, I'm reminded of Jesus' warning to the church in Ephesus in Revelation 2:4-5: "4 Nevertheless I have somewhat against thee, because thou hast left thy first love.
5 Remember therefore from whence thou art fallen, and repent, and do the first works; or else I will come unto thee quickly, and will remove thy candlestick out of his place, except thou repent."

Is there any hope for our country, or for any nation in spiritual decline? Are we so far gone that we can't see the danger we're in?

Is there hope for a country where aborting babies is seen as acceptable?

Is there hope for a nation that promotes same-sex marriage and gender re-identification?

Is there hope for a place where stepping on others to get ahead is okay? Can we turn back to God, or have we gone too far?

This country needs to wake up!

This country needs revival.
This country needs
a mighty move of God!
If we don't seek God now,
What will happen next?

If we keep going the way we are, what will be left for our children?

What kind of world are we handing down to them?
A world where right and wrong are flipped upside down, where truth is pushed aside, and evil is called good.

We have to ask ourselves, how much longer
Can we go on like this?
It's not just about what's happening out there in the world—
it's about what's happening here, in our hearts.
Are we seeking God?
Are we praying for change?

The time to turn back to God is now.
The time to repent is now.
We need to get serious about our faith

because the future of our country depends on it. Without God, we are lost.

God promises in 2 Chronicles 7:14, "if my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land." We live in a great country. but we need to ask how long we can go on without turning back to God. Let's humble ourselves, pray, and seek Him so that we can heal our hearts and our land.

Proverbs 14:12 says,
"There is a way which seemeth
right unto a man,
but the end thereof
are the ways of death."

We say we're a great nation, but how can that be if we turn our backs on God? We can't expect His blessings while straying from His truth.

God's patience has limits. When His protection is lifted, we risk destruction. Jesus warns us
that those who build
their lives on sand
will face a great fall.
Our nation is building on sand,
and we've gotta
get right with God.

We live in nations, but we also belong to one of two spiritual kingdoms: the kingdom of God or the kingdom of Satan.

Colossians 1:13 reminds us that we've been delivered from darkness and brought into the kingdom of His Son.

To move from the devil's kingdom to God's, we must be born again through repentance and faith in Jesus.

When we believe in Him, we are saved and become citizens of heaven.

Now, we need to live out our new identity.

Earthly kingdoms can rise and fall.
Some fade into nothing—for example, who today

knows any descendants from the ancient Hittite civilization? If America keeps declining, there's no telling how far the nation can fall unless we turn back to God.

Friends, we find ourselves in a perilous time where many place their hopes in the hands of leaders, believing that this election On Tuesday will somehow restore what has been lost. Placing your trust in presidents and political leaders can lead to a dangerous illusion.

They promise change, yet history shows that these promises Often turn into disappointment, leaving a wake of broken hopes everywhere.

In a world where leaders rise and fall like shadows, remember that the true foundation lies with the King of Creation.

He is not swayed by elections or public opinion. While political figures may lure us with their words, they are mere mortals, frail and unreliable.
Only in the eternal King we find unwavering strength and purpose.

The Bible warns us in Jeremiah 17:5, 'Cursed is the one who trusts in man.' When we invest our faith in flawed human beings, we are setting ourselves up for disappointment.

Psalm 146 echoes this warning, reminding us not to look to princes for our salvation. Instead, we should remember the stark truth: without God, all hope is but a fading shadow.

We must ask ourselves, what happens when we rely on those Who can't deliver? The answer is not just disappointment; it is a deepening despair.

Our true hope lies in the eternal promises of God, who alone can bring about the transformation we desperately need. It is time to wake up to the reality

that only God can save us from the darkness closing in around us.

The day will come
when every earthly being
will bow...not before a president,
But before Jesus,
the King of Kings,
revealing the stark reality
of where our
true hope must lie."
